ARC REPORT

The Board of Directors and Architectural Review Committee wishes to thank those homeowners who responded in a timely and positive manner to the 2012 ARC inspection. Your cooperation is truly appreciated and the results of your efforts are recognizable throughout our community. Because a majority of homeowners complied and did so in a reasonable timeframe, the BoD has decided that the ARC’s annual inspection will not be performed in 2013. However, those homeowners who did not comply with the violations noted during the last inspection are still required to complete the needed work on their property. The ARC will

make contact via email within the next 30 days to obtain a status from those homeowners still considered non-compliant.

Note that yard work (front and back) will continue to be monitored and residents not maintaining their yards will be given notice to do so. This applies to **ALL** properties in MWM.



SPECIAL PICKUPS FOR BULK ITEMS AND HOME RENOVATION PROJECTS

Homeowners are reminded that if you are considering renovation projects and your contractor does not provide for the removal of discarded items, then a Fairfax County Bulk Item Pickup must be scheduled within one week of the renovation project. Items left on the curb for long periods of time are unsightly and potentially hazardous, not to mention that the grass beneath those items will be adversely affected. This also includes large amounts of brush, yard debris or large tree limbs. *If Fairfax County does not pick up as scheduled, then it*

is your responsibility to follow up to ensure that your items are picked up in a timely manner. “ Call 703-802-3322 to schedule bulk pickup.

Disposing of any un-bagged trash in a neighbor’s trash container is discouraged and will be addressed on a case by case basis should this problem become systemic. Every home in MWM has been given a trash and recycling receptacle and every resident is expected to use them. Homeowners are also requested not to park trash/ recycling bins on mulched common areas.

Homeowners are also reminded that trash, including items for special bulk pickup is not to be placed on curbs until Monday evening. This is strictly prohibited per MWMHOA bylaws.

UPDATE ON THE SEARCH FOR AN HOA MANAGEMENT COMPANY

MWMHOA Board of Directors has begun the process of hiring a professional management company to handle the financial and administrative actions for our HOA. The rapid and ongoing changes with regards to HOA legal and financial matters associated with any HOA, as well as, the limited community support offered by homeowners for MWMHOA support the board’s decision to look into hiring a professional management company. Initial

investigation regarding this matter indicates the annual cost associated with this action to be minimal for MWM homeowners. An increase of approximately \$100.00 per year in our HOA dues is anticipated but this will be **gradually implemented over a 3 year period**. As more information is received regarding this initiative during the next few months, the Board will provide feedback to all homeowners via e-mail.

FAIRFAX COUNTY POLICY ON YARD WASTE & RECYCLING

Definition of Yard Waste: Grass, leaves and brush (i.e., small branches, twigs) from general yard maintenance. Yard waste **does not** include materials generated by tree removal, land clearing or home renovation projects. **Garden and potting soil is not considered yard waste and will not be picked up by Fairfax County.** Bags weighing more than 50 lbs will also not be picked up by Fairfax County.

How to Manage Yard Waste

- Leave it at home: Compost and/or grasscycle (leave grass clippings on the lawn) and reap the benefits! A reusable container or brown paper bag is best. They will not add contaminants to the leaves and grass when composted.
- Set it at the curb: Place leaves, grass or brush in a separate container (reusable container, paper bag or clear plastic bag). Brush can be tied in a bundle that is four feet or less. Yard waste in dark bags will likely be treated as trash and not recycled unless they are left slightly open.
- Transport it: Take yard waste to the I-66 Transfer Station or I-95 Complex. There is a small fee to process these materials.

Timelines

- Leaves, grass and brush are collected at the curb all year

long and recycled March 1 - Dec. 24. They are disposed of as trash Dec. 25 - Feb.

- Christmas trees are collected separately during the first two weeks of January.

DOG WASTE AND URINATION AGAIN

“Dog Urination and Waste” seems to be our favorite topic! We addressed this issue in previous newsletters yet it continues to plague our community, especially in the Mount Woodley Place common areas.

Do the right thing - pickup your pet's waste, double bag it in accordance with Fairfax County Trash Removal, and discard it in your trash container. Do not throw your pet waste bags in your neighbor's trash or in any container but your own.

Be courteous and do not let your pet urinate on flower beds, private yards, or common area flowers and shrubs. There is sufficient common area for your pet to do his/her business without ruining your neighbor's grass or flower beds. If your pet urinates in the same spot and you notice the grass is dying then please guide your pet to another spot. Huge yellow spots in the grass are a clear indication of repeated pet urine.....we ask for your cooperation and common sense in this matter.
